# **Kingsway Regional Middle School Afterschool Activities & Clubs**



Kingsway Regional Middle School will be offering an extensive list of clubs and activities for the upcoming school year. Some clubs will be seasonal and others are targeting dates throughout the entire year. In an effort to make clubs and activities available to everyone, we are using Schoology as an application for signing up online.

#### **How to Sign Up For Clubs/Wellness Activities:**

- 1. Students will view all of the offered clubs and activities on our website under the "Clubs/Activities" tab. Each activity/club will have a Schoology code.
- 2. Students will log into Schoology. Once in Schoology, students will go to the "Groups" tab, click "My Groups" in the upper right corner, and click the option to "Join Group" also in the upper right corner.
- 3. Students will then input the club or activity code to "join". Students can "join" or show interest in as many clubs/activities as they are interested in.
- 4. Once students have "joined" or shown interest in a club/activity, on the day that the club/activity meets, the club advisor will invite ALL of the students who have previously "joined" the group (via Schoology) to sign up for the after school session on a Google Form
- 5. Students can sign up for the club/activity between 7:40 AM and 8:08 AM during homeroom/arrival.
- 6. Advisors will take up to 30 students per date of the session. This is on a first come first serve basis and only accessible to students who have "joined" the group prior to the day of the session.
- 7. Students should contact home if they are staying after school.

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- In order to sign up to stay for a club, students **MUST "Join" clubs via Schoology first**; this can occur at any time throughout the year.
- Students are <u>not</u> locked into an activity for the entire year and can participate in multiple clubs and activities they want during the year.
- On a given day, students should only sign up for one club/activity to allow space for others that want to participate.
- Please feel free to visit the middle school website under clubs and activities for a full list.
   Please note, according to District Policy 5536, in order to attend KRMS after school clubs and wellness activities, parents must provide consent to participate in our random testing for alcohol and other drug use programs. In addition, students must have all obligations met and be in "Good Standing" as far as the discipline code.

The goal is for students to build empathy, independence, resilience, and humility, and come to understand that through their individual actions, they make a positive difference in the lives of others.

Debate Club is a great place for students to explore the art of "organized arguing." Students in the Debate Club tend to enjoy discussing current issues, and if they do not already have a strong voice and good presentation skills, they will learn these abilities in a fun, safe club environment. The club's purpose is to teach and train students in the fundamentals of debate, public speaking and essay writing.

Dragon SPARK Club stands for Students Promoting Attitudes of Respect and Kindness. The goal of SPARK club is to promote inclusion on our campus, by creating a space for safety and acceptance. Dragon SPARK members are leaders amongst their peers and represent the meaning of SPARK. SPARK members will be given numerous

leadership opportunities throughout the school year to promote positive acceptance of everyone.

Game Club is an opportunity for students to engage in some friendly competition over some traditional board games. Some of these games require a great deal of strategy, but most of all, a great deal of fun is had by all.

Garden Club provides an opportunity for students that are interested in caring and cultivating plants for both their personal vegetable gardens and/or ornamental gardens. This club will also help to beautify the Kingsway campus as well.

KRMS News Club highlights the "happenings" of Kingsway Middle School. Students in the club take pictures of activities that take place both during and after school. These pictures (with accompanying stories) are added to the Kingsway website. Additionally, the KRMS News Club creates a monthly picture presentation to be shown during each student lunch period, and pictures and stories are sent to the local newspaper, as well. Finally, the KRMS News Club puts together an end of the year presentation for the graduating 8th grade class.

Living History Club is an unmediated approach to historical education that grants students access to the abundant historical sites in the immediate vicinity. Placing emphasis on remembrance history, the importance of visualization, and exposure to primary sourcing.

MathCounts exists to challenge students with higher-order mathematical problems. Students will solve problems both independently and in groups online, and the advisor will take a "hands-off" approach to assisting students, thus freeing students to deepen their knowledge of the content as they discover the connections embedded within each problem.

Students will also have the opportunity to enter competitions as the year progresses.

The Odyssey of the Mind Club features many interesting projects throughout the year. These include, but are not limited to, the following: problem solving, critical thinking, creative projects, etc. Furthermore, the Odyssey of the Mind Club focuses on Science and Engineering skills, as well as enriching other subject areas.

The Pep Band is centered around the talents of our musically inclined students and how they can use enjoyable tunes to create a positive impact on others in the school.

STEM Science Club's central focus is learning how to apply every day science into their daily lives. This will be a hands-on opportunity for scientific learning, as well as, understanding scientific principles and exploring their uses.

The Writing Club - Allows Students to have the opportunity to be creative and produce pieces of work, using unconventional formats beyond what they do in the classroom. Students that enjoy exploring their own creativity, love to write, or simply want to sharpen their skills will be drawn to this club.
