

Advanced Placement Courses



Advanced Placement, or AP, refers to college level courses taught according to The College Board Advanced Placement Program and/or to courses designed to prepare students for College Board AP Tests. Success in AP courses can be an important factor in admission to colleges and universities. Successful performance on AP tests (a score of 3, 4, or 5 on a five-point scale) may lead to college credit and/or advanced placement in college. For further information on policies for granting of AP credit, consult the catalogs of specific colleges and universities. AP courses receive appropriate weight in the Grade Point Average (GPA).

Kingsway has a variety of enrichment programs and opportunities to advance student interest and help students meet their post-secondary goals.

We offer over 20 AP courses and approximately 20 courses on-site that award college credits while in high school. On average, our AP testers earned a 3 or higher, which exceeds state and global percentage.
